## Malawi Group News

Following our last trip to Malawi in 2012 we gave a presentation at a Maranatha ‘First Sunday’ gathering. Following that meeting we received a donation of £300 as a response to the information we shared about a group of pastors in Southern Malawi of whom only a very few had a Bible. Whilst out there we had been able to buy 23 Bibles for those of the group that we had met but there were about 50 others that we did not meet.

Before Christmas we made arrangements with Clapperton Mayuni, the Executive Director of the Bible Society of Malawi for us to send him the £300, less the transfer costs, in order that Moses, our contact in Nchalo, could go to the Bible House in Blantyre and collect them.

Moses has let us know that he was able to collect 54 Chichewa bibles and 10 English ones. However Moses explained that not all the Bibles went to pastors as he felt God had other plans: To place Bibles in police cells!


Moses said *“When the Officer in charge for Ngabu Police Station heard about the Bibles he approached me to request for Bibles which could be used at the police station by people on remand waiting to be taken to court and others who are serving sentences with minor offences and outside custody. Every day they come to do various work at the Police Station until they complete serving the sentence.*”

*This is another Ministry which MARANATHA could work (You can call it prison ministry.) Criminals are reformed and end up receiving Christ and joining different churches.”*

We praise God for Moses’s sensitivity to God’s call and the way that this is enabling the Kingdom to grow. We look forward to visiting Ngabu Police Station when we next visit Malawi and exploring whether this particular ministry should grow.

We are also extremely grateful to those other Maranatha groups and individuals who have helped us continue to support other work in Malawi in recent months.
