## WHAT ARE WE PERCEIVING?

**Worldwide move of God's Spirit.** If we want to see what our Father is doing, we must be willing to ascend to see from a Heavenly perspective. Without this, our vision can be limited by our circumstances and obscured by the things of the world. Similarly, if we ascend alone, we can't see the full picture – we need the global Body of Christ for a full perspective.

**Widespread deception distracts our focus.** Whether in the form of misinformation, biased or agenda-driven reporting, or a pervasive spiritual blindness, many are easily deceived and led astray. Our individualism has led to the exaltation of personal feelings and opinions over Truth and has become the defining idol of Western culture, hidden in plain sight.

**Widening divisions.** Healthy debate in pursuit of Truth has been replaced with tribalism, intolerance, hostility and polarised opinion, amplified and accelerated by social media. There is increasing fragmentation at every level of society and across nations, now reaching a critical state.

## HOW FULL ARE YOU?

For many, there is a looming sense of emptiness in the weeks and months ahead. The reality of loss – a loved one; a job; a home; health; the list goes on – is dawning on us all. Loneliness and days depleted of activity or human contact are taking their toll. Many homes are juggling home-working and home-schooling, increasing stress. How does this day-to-day reality compare with Jesus' promise that He has come to give us **“everything in abundance, more than you expect – life in its fulness until you overflow!”** (Jn 10.10 TPT)?

As Christians, this is a vital question, but it's also vital for those who need to receive this overflow of God's abundance through us! Paul writes, “In Christ all the fulness of the Deity lives in bodily form, and you have been given fulness in Christ” (Col 2.9). Similarly, Paul describes the Church as **“[Christ's] body, the fulness of him who fills everything in every way.”** (Eph 1.23).

Mourning loss and expressions of grief are very important in our life journey and not to be dismissed. Lament has been an essential form of expression for the people of God for generations. As members of Christ's Body, we can be His presence for those around us, reaching out in love to those in need, as we reach and cry out to God our Father in our need. Our simple prayer is that the Spirit of God will fill the empty places, that His Spirit will bring new life where there has been loss and death.

As we intercede in this way, our emptiness is transformed into a space of opportunity – an increased capacity to receive Christ's love and grace, which releases healing for our souls. As we open our hearts to the flow of God's grace, we become channels of His grace for others. As John testifies, **“For from his fulness we have all received, grace upon grace.”** (Jn 1.16).

## AN OPPORTUNITY TO GIVE

Fr Charles, one of our members who is an Anglican priest in Malawi, has been made Archdeacon of Lowershire. He was tasked by the bishop to complete the building of a health centre, which has been unfinished for years. Fr Charles has accomplished this and has asked for our help to equip it. The facility will provide health care for the local community of 80,000 people. We know Fr Charles personally through our trips to Malawi.
